South Carolina weather, well that's a totally nother story. In the South we go from 8 degrees to 60 degrees within a matter of hours! You just never know if you're gonna have ice, sleet, snow, or sun! With all that said, I hate the cold, let me just be very clear about that! I not only hate the cold, but I am not fond of ice, or sleet or snow either. Years ago, when I had nothing to worry about but myself, I didn't mind the beauty of the snow. But with animals, cows and calves and horses, and feeding and watering and breeding and clipping and.....well, 40 degrees is about as cold as I like for it to get! I know it's beautiful and all, but beauty, well it's great if it comes and goes all within a matter of hours!

Not only is their dry matter important, but you have got to, I mean GOT TO, keep good minerals and blocks out for your herds. Skimp somewhere else, but never skimp on your mineral programs! Also, don't forget to check your herds water source daily to ensure troughs are not frozen, and that there has not been a water pipe break due to the extreme cold temps. All of this I know you know, it's just a quick reminder!

Yes - I know we all have to feed what we have baled, but you can always supplement your cows with different lick tubs to offset your deficiencies in your hay. Best thing to do is always get your hay tested, then you know going into these harsh winter months what's your best hay verses what is your worst hay, then you'll know what you need to be supplementing your mamas on.


